

Acquiring easements or rights of way

Typically, pipeline looping projects mean we will need an additional 25 feet of permanent easement for operation and maintenance of the pipeline. During construction, temporary workspace adjacent to the permanent easement is needed. All temporary workspace will be returned to the landowner after construction and restoration for his or her full use.

If you are affected by new pipeline construction, a Williams representative will meet with you to make certain the job is performed with the least possible impact to you or the environment. Our land representatives will be available before, during and after the project to discuss any special concerns you may have.



Steps for acquiring rights of way (easements):

1. Upfront information
2. Fair compensation
3. Prompt payment to landowners
4. Advance notice of construction activities
5. Landowner still retains ownership of land
